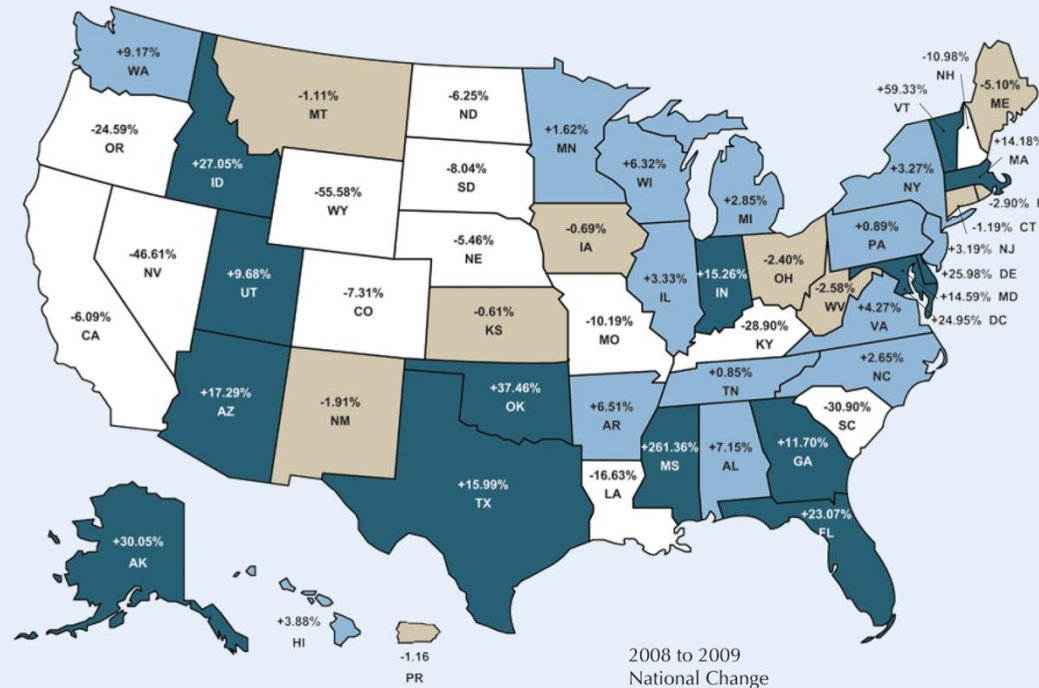

What is **Family Promise** of NewRock?

- ▶ A non-profit program for Homeless Children and their Families **in Rockdale & Newton**
- ▶ **Collaborative**, Non-denominational, Inter-faith & Self-supporting
- ▶ **Transitional hospitality** services– not a shelter
- ▶ Leverages **existing community** facilities & human resources
- ▶ **Proven concept**: 165 Networks, in 41 states, 53 in development

Family Homelessness is Growing

MAP 1.3 Family Homeless Population by State

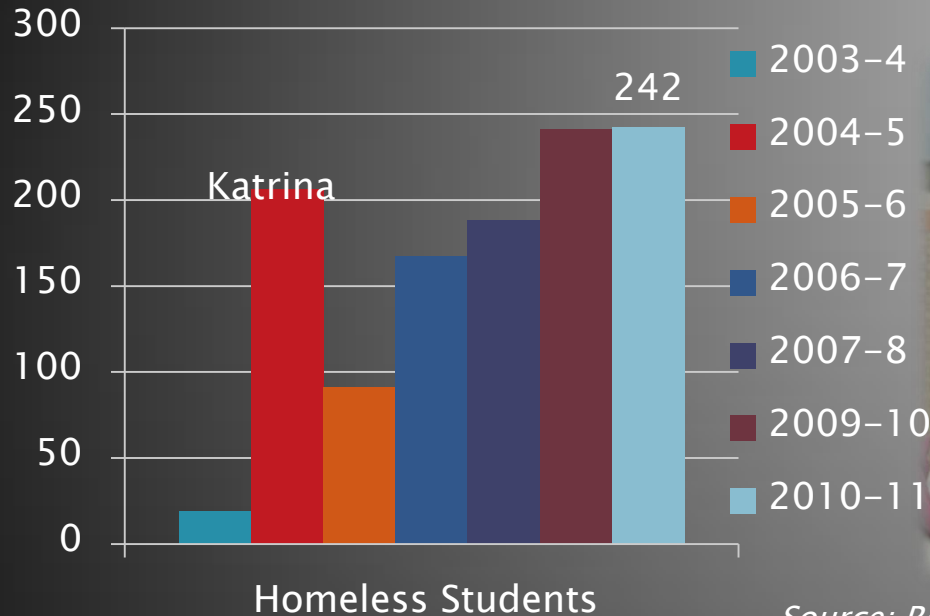


Homeless Persons in Families % Change 2008 to 2009

White	-55.58% to -5.46%	Light Blue	+0.01% to +9.67%
Tan	-5.45% to 0.00%	Dark Blue	+9.68% to +261.36%

Per the “State of Homelessness in America 2011,” a report by the National Alliance to End Homelessness, **Georgia** showed the **13th largest increase** in Homeless Persons in Families, measured 2009 over 2008, **at 11.7% .**

Who & How Does This Help?



▶ Guests: max 3–4 Families (14 people) at a time

- Safe, homelike environment
- Children continue in school
- Parents receive job & home placement assistance to regain sustainable independence
- Families stay together

▶ Volunteers

- Make a difference, directly & locally
- Wide range of activities, flexible schedules, levels of commitment
- Opportunity to network and collaborate within the community

▶ Congregations

- Fulfill a Basic Mission: “Whatever you do for the least of my people, that you do unto Me.”
- Local outreach using existing facilities & human resources
- Interfaith effort builds community

▶ Community

- Cost efficient & collaborative use of existing resources
- No institutional shelter issues
- Easy integration with agencies and local programs avoids duplication
- Fosters commitment to mutual goals



Does it Really Work? (national results)

Homeless Individuals served as Family Promise
Guests in 2010 = 11,763

- Guests who are **children** = 57 %
46 % are age **5 or under**

- Average length of stay = 61.8 Days

Housing Status at Exit

- ▶ Families securing permanent housing = 60.2%
- ▶ Families securing transitional housing = 16.4%

Bottom Line Results:

76.6% **NOT homeless** after 62 days

What's Involved to Make this Happen?

▶ 13 Host Congregations

Provide physical space, dinner & breakfast, and fellowship for 14 (max) people or 3-4 families for seven consecutive nights, approx 4 times per year.



▶ Support Congregations or Other Groups

Provide volunteers and financial help.

▶ Day Center

Hub for network, Director's Office for case management, counseling & support services; Shower & laundry facilities.

Day Center is shared with Phoenix Pass based on written agreement.

▶ Transportation

15 -passenger van for daily transport
Truck/van/trailer to relocate family belongings to Host Congregations

▶ Volunteers

35-50 positions per week, from meals to homework, financial counseling to just compassionate "being there."

▶ Community Agencies

Initial screening, qualification & intake for guests.

Experienced, "System-wise" Support & Guidance, Grant- Funds Integration.

▶ Funding

501(c) Non-Profit, self-supporting. Must raise funds through contributions & grants. (Need is Approx \$100,000 for 1st year budget)

Extensive training by regional and
national Family Promise staff is

levels.

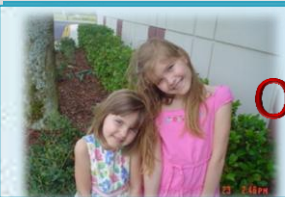
Collaboration with Phoenix Pass,
